

I. Introduction

This regulation applies to the "Asiatic Archery Rebel" Contest, 2024 edition.

It defines the minimum regulations governing this event. During this event, and at the sovereign decision of the organization dictated by organizational or safety imperatives, certain elements of this regulation may be adapted.

If necessary, all participants will be informed to ensure fairness for all.

II. Shooter Categories

There is no distinction of category among athletes. Regardless of gender, age, or type of bow, all shooters compete in the same category. Shooters must shoot with both eyes open.

III. Events

Shooting takes place on a known terrain, at unknown distances. There are 3 events:

- Precision event
- Speed event
- Dynamic event

On the terrain, and for each event, the shooter must respect the marking of the shooting zone:

- Yellow stake: beginning of the shooting zone.
- Red stake: end of the shooting zone.

IV. Shooting Equipment

Only the mentioned equipment is authorized and counts for the competition. These may be checked at any time. In case of violation during shooting, the shooter may be disqualified from the competition.

1. Bow

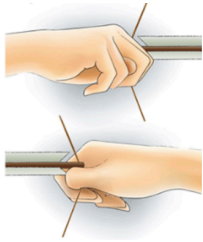
The bow must be of Asian type: with siyahs, no arrow rest, no sighting system. Modern materials such as fiberglass, carbon, etc., are allowed, as well as traditional materials (horn, sinew), or equivalents. Specific Asian bows, Korean, Japanese, Manchu, Assyrian, are allowed.

There can be no reference points, composed of a single piece (which can be detachable), meaning that the limbs are a direct extension of the handle.

No other elements than the handle extended from the limbs and the string are allowed.

The bow may include an integrated arrow rest or two in the case of an ambidextrous bow.

No equipment such as sight, stabilizer, damper, or counterweight can be used. No draw length control device is allowed. Only thumb release is permitted.



2. Strings

The string can have any texture except metallic.

It can be composed of any number of strands.

The string may have a central protection (serving) for placing the fingers used to draw the bow.

A serving is also allowed at both ends of the string to protect it from the bow limbs.

A nocking point may be added to the serving to attach the arrow nock and one or two nocking points.

The serving of the string cannot obstruct the athlete's field of vision when the shooter's draw length is maximum.

The bowstring and serving must not contain any reference points, peep sight, or any other means serving as an aiming aid.

The string cannot integrate a reference for the lips or the nose. It must be in good condition.

3. Arrows

Arrows of all types are allowed but cannot exceed a diameter of 9.3mm.

They must be marked with the name or initials of the shooter and be strictly identical in target.

The choice of feather material, placement, number, and size is up to the shooter.

Only target or field points, in good condition, glued or screwed, are allowed.

Their diameter cannot exceed 9.4mm.

Hunting points are prohibited.

4. Others

Cameras, binoculars, photographic equipment, or devices intended to determine distances are not allowed on the shooting range regardless of their use.

5. Equipment Defects

In case of equipment defects, the shooter must be able to resolve it within the allotted shooting time, without prejudice to other shooters or the organization.

V. Competition Procedure

1. General Rule

The competition schedule will be communicated to people registered during the event.

The scoring regulation and target style will be communicated 15 days before the event.

Shooting instructions will be posted in front of each event, at least in English.

2. Shooting Time

The shooting time for each event is specific and specified before each event.

Once the shooter has shot their arrows, they must withdraw from the shooting area. An archer who exceeds the authorized shooting time will have their subsequent shots, in the same round, canceled.

Only arrows in target count.

The entire scoring area may be used unless otherwise indicated at the waiting stake.

VI. Roles and Responsibilities

1. Organizer

After setting up the course and managing registrations, the organizer forms the groups and appoints the group leaders who act as referees.

At the end of the competition, they establish the results and plan the awards ceremony.

Results will be published within 7 days.

2. Referee

The referee is the sole judge on their event and controls the course of shooting in the event dedicated to them.

To this end, they control compliance with procedures, shooting times, and scoring by each shooter on the scorecard. They ensure the rotation of shooters within their group during shooting.

They check the equipment of the course as well as the competitors' equipment before the event and at any time during the competition.

3. Jury

A committee, composed of three people, designated before the start of the competition, will handle any eventual claims.

VII. Anti-Doping and Sports Ethics

No alcoholic beverages may be transported or consumed on the shooting and training areas by anyone before and during shooting hours.

Smoking is not accepted during the contest in the shooting field.

The consumption of alcohol by shooters is prohibited throughout the duration of the competition.

The use of doping substances is strictly prohibited.

No unfair behavior will be tolerated.

Such behavior from an athlete or someone assisting an athlete will result in disqualification from the competition.

VIII. Participation Fees

Registrations are only done through an online form, available on the website www.ArcheryRebelClub.be or the website of Asiatic Archery Belgium.

Registration deadline: June 16, at midnight.

Registration is only validated after payment of the participation fee.

The amount of the participation fee is set at €50 (€60 with a meal and 2 non-alcoholic drinks).

This amount is to be transferred to the account of the Archery Rebel Club:

No full or partial refund will be granted, even in case of participant withdrawal.

IX. Individual Prizes

These are equipment prizes given by Alibow : a laminated bow for the first, a fiber glass bow for the second and the third.

These prizes will not be exchanged for cash and must be taken away on-site at the end of the competition.

X. Image Rights and Data Management

Every participant grants image rights to the organizers to freely distribute photos of the event.

They also authorize the organizers to use their personal data but only for organizational purposes.

XI. General Information

The event is organized by the Archery Rebel club (Belgium) and Asiatic Archery Belgium.

Mr. Armin Hirmer is the event's patron.
